SEXUAL ASSAULT

- **Sexual Assault is defined as the intentional sexual contact characterized by use of force, threats, intimidation, or abuse of authority or when the victim does not or cannot consent. Sexual assault includes rape, forcible sodomy (oral or anal sex), and other unwanted sexual contact that is aggravated, abusive, or wrongful (including unwanted and inappropriate sexual contact), or attempts to commit these acts.**
- **Sexual assault is a crime incompatible with military service. It contradicts an environment of dignity and respect where sexual assault is NOT tolerated, condoned or ignored.**



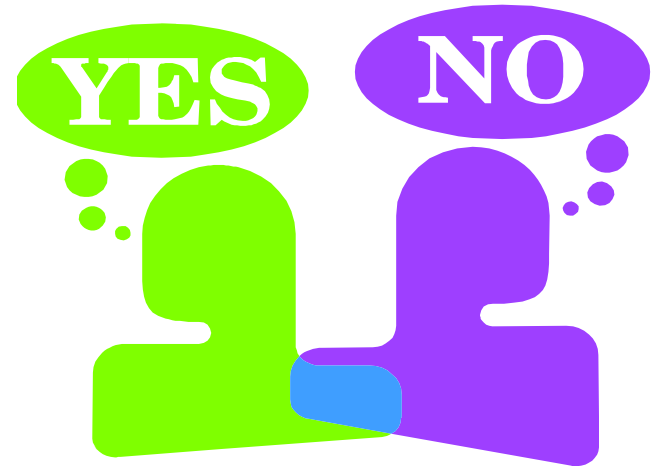
WHAT IS CONSENT?

Consent IS:

- **Words or overt acts indicating freely given agreement to the sexual conduct at issue by a competent person.**

Consent is NOT:

- **Cooperation that results from force, threat or fear**
- **Failure to verbally or physically resist due to fear**
- **Possible when someone is incapacitated, unconscious or asleep**
- **Note: A current or previous dating relationship of manner of dress of the person DOES NOT constitute consent**





ALCOHOL, DRUGS & SEX



**IF A PERSON IS
SUBSTANTIALLY INTOXICATED
OR INCAPACITATED, HE/SHE
CANNOT LEGALLY CONSENT
TO SEX!**

Signs that someone is substantially intoxicated due to drugs or alcohol:

- Drowsiness
 - Bloodshot, glassy eyes
 - Slurred speech
 - Stumbling
 - Difficulty remembering
 - Slow response to questions
 - Sweating profusely
 - Lack of focus and eye contact
 - Clumsy, uncoordinated
 - Falling asleep
 - Confusion
 - Agitation
 - Dilated pupils
 - Drooling
 - Trance-like state
- **ALCOHOL is the 'weapon of choice' to facilitate sexual assaults!**



ACTIVE BYSTANDER INTERVENTION

ACTIVE BYSTANDER STRATEGIES:

- **Encourage co-workers, family or friends to use the buddy system**
- **Step in when you see co-workers, family or friends displaying inappropriate behavior**
- **Intervene when you see the potential for a sexual assault and engage law enforcement as needed**
- **Be aware of severely intoxicated/incapacitated co-workers, family or friends and provide the necessary assistance**
